

INT. AUDITORIUM - DAY

Dr. Liz is giving a presentation to potential students and their families. Screen is behind and to the right of Dr. Liz. The Auditorium is full of 2 and 3 yr olds and their parents.

DR. LIZ

Welcome to Fouroua Milfs University, the place where you can rest assure that your child will be taught only in the way that your child learns best. Your child will accel beyond your wildest dreams as we have techniques that have been proven to work. Our techniques are so advanced, that many critiques have claimed that our school is too easy. Those allegations are false. However, we like to first address those allegations before moving on to what this school can and will do for you child.

INT. AUDITORIUM - DAY

Dr. Liz turns towards screen and pushes button to start slide show of Oxford University and of her students being tested.

DR. LIZ

We have asked Oxford University to take our students in the Gakushi level, which is roughly ages 7 through 12, and test them using the exact same test that incoming freshmen would take to test out of classes. We asked them to test them in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, English, Mathematics, and in several Foreign Languages. The results shocked Oxford University staff. Here is what Dr. Wessex had to say about the results...and I quote. "We have tested the students in all of the areas we agreed on, including Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics and many languages. We have found that those who are aged 7,8 and 9 did not do as well on the Math test as they have not yet learned the material. This was to be expected. However, that was not the case with Science, English, Japanese and French. They have proven to passed the test with such high results that if they were to attend Oxford, we would have to pass them out of the complete first year of Japanese and French. As far as Science is concerned, it was only Biology that they excelled in, having not had Chemistry nor Physics yet. However, all the other students did exceedingly well in all of the tests. Those students aged 10, would have been allowed to skip the first semester in Chemistry and Physics. Those age 12 and older would have successfully tested out of even more Chemistry, with the 15 yr olds and older, testing completely out of Inorganic Chemistry. Further more, we found that the students were able to take similiar tests, including Physics and Chemistry, written completely in Japanese and do as well on those test as they did in English, their native tongue. We, at Oxford, have drawn the conclusion that 3,900 students at Fouroa Milfs University and their test scores is adequate proof of the superior teaching at Fouroa Milfs. Further more, we find that it is impossible for one school to attract that many prodigies in order to slant the scores in such a small amount of time. We did go ahead, behind Dr. Liz's back, and

secretly tested the incoming 3 yr olds and 4 yr olds. The results have proven that the students do not come in as prodigies. Rather, they are taught how to be prodigies.

INT. AUDITORIUM - DAY

Dr. Liz starts the next slide show of Fouroa Milfs University. Coughing is heard. A little girl blows her nose.

DR. LIZ

Due to the effects of our teaching techniques, we have been forced to alter the schedule in which students are traditionally taught what. If we did not, we would have been stuck with a bunch of bored students with nothing to learn. Why? We have found that students finish the work traditionally taught in levels 1 - 6 by the time they turn 7 yrs old.

INT. AUDITORIUM - DAY

An irate man stands up and yells.

MR. YENTEL

Lies! I've studied psychology for many years and wrote several books on the subject and you are a bloody liar!

DR. LIZ

If I was lying then how do you explain Oxford University's test results with my students? Surely, they weren't lying as well. Now, if you will let me continue. (coughing is heard and people shuffling in their seats uncomfortably) We have found that 3 yr olds are quite capable of learning Japanese. As it is, Japan is full of toddlers who speak the language. Thus, the argument that children must be older in order to understand Japanese is rubbish. Or, am I sadly mistaken? Is the truth that Japanese toddlers actually speak English until they are old enough to understand Japanese? Now, there's a concept. Or rather, is it that English children are naturally stupid and incapable of ever reaching the superior intellectual level of a Japanese child much younger than they are? Again, rubbish! Your child will learn Life Science, the study of plants and animals, English, Japanese, and Jytty - the language of Jyttian People, which your child is apart of because of their special abilities. They will also learn how to use both computers that you are use to, and Bio-computers. Social Science will cover our community and the cities they live in. They will have Phy-ed, Music and Art. Music and Art classes allows the student to choose what medium or instrument they want to learn. They also get to choose the songs in their level of ability, that they wish to learn. INT. FOUROA MILFS BOOKSTORE - DAY

Bev and Kat grab two large carts and find the books and tools they need for school. Other students are hustling to get their items. Noise level is loud with lots of chatter.

BEV

I can't believe it! Finally, I get to do some real research after having to suffer through five years of intense boredom!

KAT

I know! I can't believe we had to learn Japanese when we already speak the language fluently. And Jytty was way too easy.

INT. FOUROA MILFS BOOKSTORE - DAY

A student interrupts the conversation in a snotty way.

PATTY

Just because you two were born knowing everything in the entire universe, doesn't make the classes boring. If anything, the only thing thats a bore is you two.

KAT

(yawn, looks in Patty's direction)

Indeed, the only thing interesting about the classes was watching one person, who shall remain nameless, struggle trying to figure out which hand to write her hiragana in when it was Kanji we were studying.

BEV

Totally! (points to Patty) Bloody hell! When did she get here? I didn't know she knew how to find the bookstore? After all, wasn't it she who got lost in the loo?

KAT

But of course! Will miracles ever seise? Come on! We had better find our research books before the best ones are taken.

INT. FOUROA MILFS BOOKSTORE - DAY

Kat and Bev grab books and tools off the shelves as quickly as possible. Students push and shove. Oof, ugh and watch out is heard in various languages. Kat finds book in strange language and hands it to Bea.

KAT

I can't believe this book! Look!

BEV

Wow! I wonder what language this is in? This isn't in any of the languages taught here.

KAT

Let's hide it. I don't think this book was ever for sale.

BEV

I'm with you. I'll put it under my coat.

KAT

Wait! Let me check it for security tags, just in case.

BEV

Believe me, there isn't.

INT. DORM ROOM - DAY

Kat and Bev spread out on the large canopy bed. The dorm room has a large walk-in closet, a kitchenette with a small fridgerator and separate freezer that same size as the fridgerator, 2 powerful microwaves, 2 burner stove, 2 ovens specially designed for pizza's, 2 love seats, 2 large canopy beds, and 2 desks that surround a person on three sides. The hallway noise is not heard.

BEV

These characters are like nothing I've seen before on one hand, but on the other, it resembled Japanese that has been altered.

KAT

I wonder if someone did that purposefully so that we might be able to figure out what it says? You know, like a cipher.

BEV

Don't know. Maybe.

Bev turns the pages of the book to the first page. Kat peers over Bev's shoulder to read.

KAT

We should look which character has the most letters.

BEV

That really won't matter. It isn't English written in another language. We will have to write out all the sentences one word to a square in a straight line, with each sentence below each other. What I mean is...just hand me some graphpaper and be done with it!

Kat got off the bed and grabbed a very large sheet of graph paper. Bev takes the graph paper and makes columns, each 5 squares wide. She then starts to carefully copy the sentences in the book onto the graphpaper. Kat looks on curiously. Bev stews.

BEV

Hm. I still can't figure it out. I know that this is what they do! I've seen it.

Kat grabs the book from Bev and flips through the pages.

KAT

This is what we want! It clearly says "Jyntty! Ha!"

BEV

Give me that! It does not!

Bev grabs the book and stares.

KAT

See! I told you!

BEV

Do you know what this means? This was left by a former student here, who had jynttied off to some planet, bought the book and hid it on campus.

KAT

Its funny what conclusions you draw
just by reading two words.

INT. OFFICE

Liz is standing by the window. John is shuffling through papers. Students are heard in the other room asking various questions.

LIZ

I suppose I should go make that
announcement being that you forgot to
tell them in assembly.

JOHN

Well, if I remember correctly, it was
you who forgot last year. Anyways, I
should do it. Afterall, its was my
omision.

LIZ

That's okay. I'm not doing anything
anyways. On second thought, I think I
had better use Vynty.

JOHN

You had better do your telepathy in
English. Not everyone knows Jynty
yet.

LIZ

Venduhitis!

JOHN

What?

LIZ

Jynty? And you think I'm going to use
Jytty to make my announcement? Get
real!

JOHN

I did not say Jynty! You just can't
hear.

LIZ

I did hear you say Jynty. I know you meant Jytty. But please, lets stop assuming anyone who is not you is going to have less the stellar thinking and reasoning. Some people are quite capable of thinking and reasoning for themselves and drawing the correct conclusion.

JOHN

Sorry! I didn't mean it as a put down.

John continues looking for something amongst his papers.

LIZ

You might want to organize that. I'm willing to help after I make my announcement, that is, if you want me to.

JOHN

No, I think I can manage. Usually, I know exactly where everything is, however, someone, who shall remain nameless, turned on the fan - that can't be helped. How was SHE to know I had it off for a reason.

LIZ

Sorry! I didn't know the Janitor turned up the speed on that thing.

JOHN

It wasn't the janitor. I suspect some kids playing around, trying to pull a joke on me. I sense it, but hadn't had the time to sort it out yet.

INT. OUTER OFFICE

Liz walks over towards the microphone and just stops herself. Several students push and shove trying to get to the counter first.

LIZ

(telepathically)

Attention all students! Every Thursday at 5pm, the dorm rooms will be inspected. All dorm rooms will be kept open at 5pm. You will be allowed to close the door after your room has been inspected. In your last class, you will each get an inspection sheet. You will hand all of the inspection sheets to the inspector when he or she gets there. For those who prefer to actually use a Vacuum cleaner to suck up dirt, rather than using jyntu to move it to the garbage, can find plenty of Vacuum cleaners at the end of every hallway, in the Janitors closet. Mops and brooms can also be found there. Be sure to clean everything in the bathroom as well! For anyone needing a description of everything, please see your dictionary.

INT. DORM ROOM - DAY

Bev and Kat rearrange there dorm room several times.

BEV

This just isn't going to work! I mean, no matter how we arrange this dorm room they'll know we are hiding something!

KAT

With inspection every Thursday, they are going to see all parts of the room!

BEV

Why don't we try it with the beds in the middle of the room. That way we would have some space behind the beds and beside the bookshelves for a secret room.

KAT

Thats it! No, no! We don't want the beds in the middle of the room. We want them where it would look the neatest so they don't take much notice of our room.

BEV

Huh?

KAT

To the left of the door, as you walk in, we will put our bunk beds, with desks underneath, and our bed ontop. We will put the bookshelves directly against the wall, and on 3 sides of the bunk beds, including the side by the door. It will make it nice and cozy and dark. They won't be able to see into our sleeping quarters!

BEV

Kat, you are a genius!

KAT

Thank you! Thank you! Now, our dressers will go neatly on the other side of the bookshelves, at the foot of our bed.

BEV

But how do we access the bookshelves?

KAT

The bookshelves will be facing towards the beds so that we can have shelves in our upstairs loft, and at our desk. Granted, it makes some of the bookshelves not very usable, but it will be worth it. Besides, we can crawl underneath our desk to store anything we don't want anyone finding easily, and then put the really secret stuff in the far corners of our lofts.

BEV

Let's jynty to Manchester's furniture shop to see what we can find. We might be able to find something that can go across our bunks or something.

KAT

Let's go to the Ironmonger's. They will be better for bunk beds. I have an idea.

BEV

But, will they go for it?

KAT

Who cares! By the time I'm through, they won't know the difference.

INT. IRONMONGER'S - DAY

Large shop with sparse amount of customers, spread out throughout. Some customers at the paying desk.

KAT

We are going to buy pipes and fittings. We'll need several long pipes, and some 3 meter long pipes. We'll need to get some strong flooring board too.

BEV

I'll get that. What size do we want?

KAT

16 feet. That will give us a good 12 feet to keep empty and clean. It will also be our neatnik area with our school furnished desks, with only the absolutely most necessary items placed on top of it so that they will ignore the rest of the room. It will look used, but only just used. The drawers will have key items placed inside, and dictionaries and handbooks will be placed very neatly on top, in the far corner in a wooden book holder of some sort, instead of bookends.

BEV

Good. I'll go get the wood.

KAT

Wait! Also get 2 boards 6ft wide by 16 ft., and 12 boards 2ft wide by 16ft.. Then, we want to find 4 cabinents that are 2ft deep, 4 ft. long and 3 ft. tall., 4 that are 2 1/2 feet tall or so and 4 cabinents that are 2ft deep, 4ft. long and 4 1/2 ft tall.

BEV

I'm on it!

Kat went in search for the pipes and fittings. She grabs several long pipes and several short pipes, several boxes of fittings, some tools, and then heads over to lighting. Kat then goes over to glass and gets 2 large pieces of glass cut to fit the top of the desk. She heads over to flooring and picks out some verdi pompeii laminate and has it cut to fit. BEV

Kat! There you are! What took you so long? Never mind. I see you have a full cart. I found these really cool black cabinents that have doors that snap open. They don't look like doors when you look at it.

KAT

Perfect! We are going to redo the window treatment too. I've got enough curtains and lace to outfit the entire place. Lets go to the paying desk.

BEV

Let's make sure we have everything first.

KAT

Okay, we have the wood and pipes and so on that we need for the structure. We have the wood for the desk, the cabinets to put the wood on, we have the shelves to hold all of our crap.

BEV

We need to get four more cabinets!

KAT

Why?

BEV

Easy! The eight hidden corners of our desk would be a great place to hide stuff. If we had the cabinets there in such a way that you have to push on it to get it to open out to reveal the storage area...

KAT

That's it! You are so close! Oh so close! Your idea won't quit work because of physics. However, we can have black boards that have to be taken out of its track to reveal the doors that do open when you push on them. That's how we can have the entire bottom shelves of the desk totally hidden from view. The board will have to be moved out into the other room, after one moves the bookshelves. Not even John will go through all of that!

BEV

Yea. But will we?

KAT

To hide that book and all it has to offer! You bet! We can't be too careful. Any lock can be opened. But this, they won't even know exists.

BEV

I have a better idea. Let's just put the black boards in front of the cabinents and on the side of the cabinents. You have to move the sideboard before the front board will move anywheres.

KAT

That would be more work. We would have to get the side board to stay. And, if we are too clever, John will figure it out. No, best to keep it simple. But, do we want crown moulding in our upper lofts?

BEV

We are designing this all wrong! We should really have our beds below, and the desk on top.

KAT

But of course! We have 16 foot ceilings, so its not like we can't make it work!

BEV

And with those curtains, they won't even know the top desk area exist.

KAT

I'll buy more curtains. We'll want some that only go down to the bed. And, we can have that front bit go down further, over a lower wooden side board - at the 5 foot mark. Then, on the inside, the top will go the full 3 feet to the 8 foot mark. We'll have mirrors up there and black bedding so that it reflects black everywhere.

BEV

We will want black and gold pillows to give it a sense of true space, instead of black hole space.

KAT

Right! Of course. That will give us an extra four feet for the desk area. Height-wise.

BEV

After we fix our measurements to fit reality of the new situation, we'll go pay.

KAT

Right! I'll meet you back here in half an hour?

BEV

Sounds good!

INT. DORM ROOM - DAY

Bev and Kat quickly set up their loft quarters. The inside of the bed area, contains almost complete solar system with planets, stars, and galaxies hanging from the ceiling. These glow with black light. Glow in the dark stars and galaxies are attached to the ceiling and all the sides of the bed walls. One enters the bed area from the front and then climbs in through a 3ft tall, by 4 ft wide hole. Underneath this is 2 feet. One crawls onto 16" thick mattresses with 12" memory foam placed on top, so that the mattress is 2" higher than the opening. The mattress sinks down some. Straight ahead, is four black lights in special metal fixtures. If you push up on the metal fixtures, the black lights turns off and you can climb the books shelves to get up to the desk area. The books shelves here do have some stuff on them, but are moved when its not inspection Thursday. Mirrors are found on all the walls inside the bed area. BEV

We will have to come up with some device that overrides the psy-damper fields that keep us from jyntyan at night.

KAT

Maybe, we could find a way to turn it off but such that everyone else thinks its on - including TIM. You know, like the shavas light switch.

BEV

It wouldn't work. TIM has a direct connection to it that does not use a wave that can be faked.

Bev grabs the extra copies of their school books and rearranges them on the desks by the windows. Kat goes over and helps her. They rearrange pens, papers, and other items.

BEV

We need to rearrange it as if we are really using these desks. And, every day, we are going to have to move these as if we really are using them.

KAT

I think we need to bring these books with us to our classes, and leave the other ones up stairs.

BEV

Good idea! That will make it easier for us. We won't have to climb the ladder to grab books, nor will we have to hide these books before we leave.

KAT

Exactly! You know what I am really in the mood for?

BEV

A coffee house?

KAT

Yes! But, the one in my dreams. Its hasn't been built yet.

BEV

Well, then we are going to have to design it.

KAT

Problem. We don't have a balcony we can put a waterfall on.

BEV

How about the roof?

KAT

How would we get up there?

BEV

Oh, I don't know. We could always go through that hole in our loft.

KAT

What hole?

BEV

Follow me.

Kat follows Bev, into the bed area, up the ladder and into their hidden desk area.

BEV

Draw your eye upwards towards the sky, and feast your eyes on the beauty that is nigh.

KAT

Don't quit your day job! That was awful!

BEV

Don't worry, I won't. But, do you see that square up there?

KAT

That opens? And do we know that it indeed opens to the roof?

BEV

I've not exactly checked it out that far. I sort of needed help with that, given my height and all. Or shall I say, lack of height?

KAT

(laughing)

You can say that again! Then again, I can't really speak either. Everytime you grow I grow. And being that you aren't growing hardly at all, it doesn't say much for me. How many years have we been the same height?

BEV

Thats it! We could pretend to be twins!

KAT

Problem. Everyone knows we aren't.

BEV

No! Not here! Our there! When we finally fly the coop!

KAT

Sweet! Our there? I think you mean out there.

BEV

What ever! Lets figure out how we are going to get up there.

KAT

It only 8 feet. So I think that our bookshelf ladder should work. After all, that is still technically ladder quality.

BEV

Doh! Why didn't I think of that? I only go up that part of the ladder every week because I'm so spaced out I forget to step off it on to the floor! What an idiot!

KAT

I didn't say it! You did.

BEV

I know. Just follow me, and we will see whats on the other side.

INT. UPPER LOFT - DAY

Bev and Kat climb up the bookshelf steps. Bev pushes on the white square panel. It moves on a hinge, and flips over. Sunlight floods the room.

EXT. ROOF GARDEN - DAY

Bev and Kat climb up onto the roof. They see high brick walls on all sides. Every where where the outer walls meets the roof, the wall has been extended upwards 60 feet. These walls have special openings for melted snow to drain down through pipes. The roof is heated to melt the snow. No one can see onto the roof from below, despite the window like openings in these walls. The openings of these windows are 2ft. by 2ft. and are 10 feet high.

BEV

Wow! Look at this! Just look at this!

KAT

I'm looking! I'm looking!

BEV

Just think of what we can do with this! I do hope that this is the only opening so that no one else has access to this.

KAT

I hope that the secret room we found on the other side of the school has access to this so that we can sneak back to our dorm room when need be.

BEV

Good point! Well, given that, we really are going to have to sort this space out and sort out that secret room.

KAT

We need to put in another secret room inside that secret room - one that only we know about and isn't on the original plans for this place.

BEV

The secret room that we've found
isn't on the original plans.

KAT

It isn't?

BEV

Nope!

KAT

Sweet!

EXT. ROOF GARDEN - DAY

Bev and Kat walk across the roof in search of openings to the
rooms below. They sketch out the roof and what they find.

KAT

Here's a door! I think it goes into
another dorm room.

BEV

Dare we open it?

KAT

Why don't you listen at it. Your
hearing is better than mine.

Bev bends down and puts her ear to the door.

BEV

I don't hear a thing. I'm opening it
just a peep.

KAT

Do you see anything?

BEV

Its opening has been covered
completely with ceiling.

KAT

You mean that it goes no where?

BEV

Yes, unfortunately.

KAT

But thats good isn't it? I mean, one
less place to cover.

BEV

Yes, but I'm worried that the place we want open won't be.

KAT

What do you think that chances are that all the openings to dorm rooms was like this, but the students who lived in ours found it and opened it up.

BEV

Slim to none. Not even the openings to the roof were found on the blueprints.

KAT

That has absolutely nothing to do with it, and you know it! The students wouldn't have known that. Perhaps some boys came into the room, and made a hole because they were goofing around and accidentally found the trapdoor.

BEV

Maybe.

They continue walking.

BEV

Here's another one. And I know that this one isn't over a dorm room. We've left that part of school already.

KAT

This would be directly over a hallway. I mean, this is behind the door right next to the janitor's closet in the hallway.

BEV

I think you might be right as I don't hear a thing except muffled voices.

Bev opens the trapdoor and sees a room filled with spiderwebs and years of dust.

BEV

Sorry Kat, but there's no door.

KAT

Yes, there is too a door. Its just that its not visible. I'll show you once we get inside.

BEV

Why didn't you just say that it was a secret door to a secret room?

KAT

I just didn't think I had too. Anyways, we are still 2 hallways and a curve from our desired destination and the sun will be setting soon. We'd better get a move on it.

BEV

Well, the desired room is this way.

They walked down what they think is a hall underneath, take a left and walk over another hall. Kat bends down and opens the trapdoor.

KAT

Three guesses what's behind door number 1 and none of them count.

BEV

Well, we aren't around the curve, so this definately isn't the secret room.

KAT

And, the second hallway to the curve is very long. And half-way down that hallway is what?

BEV

We are bit to the right of the hallway right?

KAT

Yes, and what is behind that door?

BEV

We can't be over John's lab. Are we?

KAT

We are exactly over John's lab. Not only that, but he just closed the door when I peeked in.

BEV

What are we going to do? He has access to the roof!

KAT

I only saw through a hole in the light fixture.

BEV

A hole? Does that mean that the ceiling was put in to cover up the trapdoor?

KAT

Yes. They just did a sloppy job of making the light fixture. Its the fixture itself that has the hole.

BEV

I wonder, if that light fixture moves. You know, moves up like ours do?

KAT

Well, with TIM in the room, I don't think we should find out. Wait! TIM has been turned off!

BEV

Sometimes, there is a power outage and TIM ends up being shut down. Now is the perfect time to fix the light fixture too.

KAT

Fortunately, I did bring my backpack. And, it is filled with the tools we need. I forgot to take them out of my backpack the last time.

BEV

Only you would carry around tools in your sack!

KAT

Well, I'll have the hole fixed in no time at all. Should we make this so that we will have access to this room when we need to?

BEV

No! Bad move. TIM is usually always on, and he would know immediately what was up.

KAT

Okay.

Kat quickly seals the hole up.

KAT

Let's go back to our room and grab some ceiling material. We are going to want to connect it to the trapdoor opening.

BEV

I'm on it. You stay here. I run faster.

Bev is seen running away. Kat applies liquid nails to all sides of the opening. Bev runs back with two pieces. Kat grabs the sealing tape, applies liquid nails to it and then applies it to one side of the board, leaving half of the width of the tape, hanging over the side. KAT

KAT

and this time not run quite so far.
We've past the door!

BEV

We are really going to have to go
eat.

They turn around and walk while talking.

BEV

If we don't get back before someone
comes to the door, they might wonder
about us.

KAT

Stop worrying!

BEV

Well, I'm going back.

KAT

Well, I'm opening the trapdoor.

BEV

Fine, I'll cover for you. I'll say
that you didn't want to stop
exploring but that you'll eat when
you get back.

KAT

Bingo!

BEV

Of course, I'm good aren't I? I can
always spin a tale when its needed.

KAT

Will you get off yourself? I found
the door to our secret room! Not only
that, but I figured out how to make
sure that only we can open the secret
door.

BEV

You have? Do tell! Forget dinner.

Kat and Bev run back to the dorm. They quickly open their trap door, and climb down the ladder. They hop out of their cave and quickly sit down at their desks and wolf down their food, barely taking time to chew. The peas roll all over the plates. Kat takes one look at Bev, who nods back a silent agreement. They grab their spoons and use their fingers to quickly help the peas onto the spoons. They grab their napkins and quickly wipe off their fingers as a knock is heard on the door. Bev goes to answer it while Kat put the dishes back on the tray. Bev opens the door and sees Liz.

LIZ

Have a lovely explore around the school have you?

BEV

Oh yes! Its beautiful.

LIZ

I'm glad you enjoyed it.

BEV

Kat brings the tray over to Liz.

KAT

The school is beautiful! However, is there any way that we can just grab extra meals and store it in our freezer?

BEV

Of course! Why do you think they provide separate freezers?

LIZ

That is exactly right. However, most students line up and fight over the carts to bring the food to their dorms.

BEV

I wanted to avoid all that. Exploring is much more fun.

LIZ

Just so you know, you might want to go grab a cart and grab some supplies before the good stuff is all picked over. John made everyone put the carts and back and eat in the lunch room first. He's also waiting for everyone to finish eating before anyone is allowed to grab anything to go.

KAT

Somehow, I thought he would do such a thing.

LIZ

Well, yes. He is a bit of a disciplinarian. He likes things orderly and not chaotic. He'd love your room though. You keep it very tidy.

KAT

That's Bev's doing. She's a neat freak so that she can focus on her studies. It does give us more time to study when we put things away like we ought to.

LIZ

I would agree! It seems a pain at first, but in the long run it really is a time saver. Well, it certainly beats hunting knee deep in papers trying to find the one piece of paper you are missing. However, John isn't a neat freak. When he's bogged down with a project, he tends to let papers pile up. But tell him I said so.

BEV

We won't.

KAT

We'll also go down to the lunch room. Perhaps we should carry the tray. Thanks for bringing it, by the way.

LIZ

No problem. But I think I'll carry
the tray.

INT. DINING ROOM - NIGHT

Kat and Bev follow Liz into the dining room. They grab a cart and some containers and quickly go grab food while John is giving a lecture on how the getting of the food for the dorms is going to happen. Liz hands the tray to the kitchen staff and goes stand out where she can block easy view of Kat and Bev, but yet not attract attention. John carries on his lecturing. Bev and Kat quickly dish up food. Two employees come over to help them. Just as the last container is put on the cart, John walks over to the other carts and see's Bev and Kat. John gives them a look. Liz walks over to John and says something to the effect of its okay, while Bev and Kat push the cart out of the dining room and down to their dorm room.

JOHN

Why did you let them go first? You
totall usurped my authority. They
could have taken seats at a table and
waited their turn like everyone else.

LIZ

I didn't think they should have to
suffer through the discipline when
they weren't apart of the chaos in
the first place.

JOHN

Of course they were! They were here,
weren't they?

LIZ

No, they weren't. They decided to
avoid the chaos and come later, after
everyone had most likely taken what
they wanted. Then, they would come
in, as ladies, take what they wanted
and leave without further ado,
leaving the childish behavior to the
children. I say they did that quite
well. Don't you?

JOHN

Humpf! I still say they went out of turn. Its their own fault they didn't show up to dinner when its called.

LIZ

My, my. Aren't we a bit think headed this evening.

John shakes his head and goes back to supervising the students.

INT. DORM ROOM - NIGHT

Kat and Bev quickly put their food away and set off into their cave after grabbing graph pads and pencils. Kat quickly sketched out the roof, while Bev worked on the study schedule plan. John and Liz knock on the door. Kat goes to answer the door.

JOHN

Hello Bev.

KAT

Kat. Bev is in there.

JOHN

Sorry, Kat. About tonight. We don't exactly require attendance on the first night, but I rather assumed that all students, especially those in their first year, would be attending.

KAT

Obviously, you are discussing our superior ability to foresee chaos and avoid it at all cost versus your lack of ability to foresee chaos and prevent it from happening before it happens. Its quite alright. We don't always get it right either.

Liz smiles and hides a laugh in her hand.

KAT

Matter of a fact, its why we came to this school. We got it wrong too many times, and felt that this school would teach us better than those other schools would.

Bev stashes the graph paper on the bookshelf and takes out instead the Jytty dictionary.

KAT

Do come in though. Liz tells us you'd rather fancy a tour.

JOHN

I would, would I? Um, not today, perhaps some other time. Just do well in school okay?

LIZ

Don't worry, John. They will. I have every confidence in them.

KAT

I can assure you that Bev will annoy the bloody hell out of the former top student with her brilliance while I try to not laugh lest I break my confidence.

Bev comes out of hiding.

BEV

Or into a sweat. Well Kat, I went over everything they have already learned, and we haven't and I figured that if we were to toss the dictionary of Jytty into our flashcard game we should be caught up within a week.

JOHN

Flashcard game?

BEV

Oh yeah. I found this website that is really cool. People can upload whatever cards they need to, and it turns into a flashcard game.

JOHN

Very interesting. Who has access to those flashcards after they are made?

BEV

We make all of our flashcards private. That forces the other students to make their own.

JOHN

Just being sure. Some languages and classes we teach here are best not released to the general public.

KAT

We know. Not everyone would treat those who can jynthy with respect.

JOHN

That isn't the half of it.

BEV

She was refering to the military and governments around the world and not the local bully.

KAT

Quite right.

LIZ

I think we can leave you two now. I'm sure you will want to get to bed early.

KAT

We plan on being in assembly bright an early at 7:30 to get a good seat.

JOHN

We will see you then. Bye!

INT. DORM ROOM - NIGHT

Kat and Bev quickly lock the door and run to their cave. They grab their graphpaper notebooks and measuring tape. Bev grabs the copy of the original blue prints that she made. Kat grabs the torches. They head to the roof.

EXT. ROOF GARDEN - NIGHT

Kat and Bev are on the roof, figuring out their game plan.

KAT

I think that we should first mark all of the trap doors.

BEV

Right! Why don't we split up. You go that way, and I'll go this way.

KAT

We need to measure as we go so that we know where to mark the trap doors. And, it would be easier if we did that together.

BEV

We should grab textbooks to use as weights. It would go much faster if we split. We do have an awful lot of space to cover, and we must make sure that no one can catch us at it.

KAT

Fine, but it will be a lack of dialogue for the script.

BEV

Huh?

KAT

Exactly why I think we should work together.

BEV

Very well, but we'll never finish tonight.

KAT

Well, we wouldn't have finished anyways. Its not like this school was built on footprint the size of a sardine can.

BEV

I know. Well, there is only this hole, and we know where it is, as I've already marked it.

KAT

Take that end of the tape and put it against the wall. I've an idea.

BEV

I'll grab the unabridged Jytty dictionary.

Bev puts the dictionary on top of the tape measure. Kat takes out another tapemeasure and puts it against the other wall so that they cross. Bev puts the other dictionary on top of the tape.

KAT

Okay, these tape measure are huge, so we should be able to measure in a straight line until we reach a wall. We'll use these tape measures to get a straight line to the trap door edges.

BEV

KAT

I'm going to at least give me the rough measurements - you know, the overall width. The length I already have memorized.

BEV

It shan't take you long to memorize the width.

KAT

I just want that number down in case I start changing it in my confusion with math class.

Kat grabs her bagel and butters it. She grabs cheese and slaps it on the bagel. She grabs a cold cooked egg and slaps that on the bagel.

KAT

You know, if we were to design the space to be fluid, we could rearrange it on a dime whenever the whim hits us.

BEV

You know how difficult that would be. We'd have to have everything on wheels.

Bev eats while putting her books together. Kat goes into the cave and grabs the blueprints. She scribbles notes into a graphpaper book, while taking bites of her sandwich.

KAT

So what? Wheels aren't that bad of a thing. Besides, it would make it easier to take it with us when we leave here.

BEV

That is going to be a problem. We can't just hire a moving team.

KAT

We wouldn't have to. We would jynty the stuff to our new place.

BEV

Maybe, we wouldn't have to! We could always stay on the roof when we decide to leave town. No one would ever find us there. Not even John.

KAT

I assure you, even he would finally look there.

BEV

Not if we change that area to be not accessible.

KAT

And how, pray tell, do we do that?

BEV

I don't know. But, I am sure that we will learn soon enough. I mean, we are apart of the new generation that has lost their special powers due to evil technology. I am sure we will learn all about that sort of thing. Won't we?

KAT

Maybe. But, I doubt we will be taught how to make them! We'd better go, or we won't get to assembly by 7:30, like we said we would.

BEV

I doubt John is going to check to see if we arrive at that time. He'll only care that we get there before it starts.

INT. AUDITORIUM - DAY

Students and staff members are assembling in the auditorium. A cacaphony of conversations is going on around Kat and Bev. Kat and Bev's parents walk into the auditorium and search for their daughters. Kat notices them and moves to hide. Bev looks at Kat strangely, look arounds, and then tries to hide. A student taps on their shoulder.

STUDENT

Hey, I think they are looking for you.

Student stands up and waves arms to get the parents attention. He then points down at Kat and Bev who sneak out of the row and move to another row. They find two open seats behind a column, on the other side of an booth that only contains a spot light and a tall chair. The parents walk up to a staff member and inquire about their daughters. Bev and Kat swallow hard. John walks by the parents, stops, and then continues walking to the podium.

JOHN

It seems that we have visitors today, brought on by a vicious rumor that has been trying to destroy the integrity of this school for a very long time. The rumor is that this school is one big fat lie. Everything we say and do is a lie. The rumor says that we pass students with A's just for showing up in class. The rumor says that we don't really teach any of the classes that we say we do. I can tell you that its a rumor. But, the rumor has that covered too, by claiming I am a big fat liar. If you wish to take your children out of this school bases on a lie, then so be it. However, I doubt your children will come quietly. I, on the other hand, would much rather see proof before buying into a lie. I am going to ask all the four year olds to come up here immediately. I want also the first 20 students who are age 10 or over to come up here.

Students get up and run to the front and go up on stage. The four year olds run too. The students line up in two groups.

JOHN

I want the four year olds over here, on my left, and the older students on my right, here. Now, each older student is going to take turns asking a four year old, in turn a question in Japanese. The answer to that question will be given in French. As I doubt that the parents speak Japanese, I am also going to have Dr. Wexler, from Oxford University come up here and translate both the question and the answer after the students have finished their round. JOHN

Now, you can force your child out of this school, but as you have not paid their tuition, I refuse to support you in it. I will allow them to come back in and school here. Secondly, if our students didn't pass those tests, and if our professors didn't pass their tests, the government would have closed us down ages ago. And, if those rumours were true, I can assure you, that The Daily would have shut us down years ago. As it is, we have not been all over the media. BEV

KAT

We greatly appreciate it.

INT. BASIC ALGEBRA - DAY

Kat and Bev reluctantly take seats way in back of the classroom. Professor_Basic_Algebra took notice and then addressed the class.

PROFESSOR_BASIC_ALGEBRA

Let it be known, that I prefer not have assigned seats. However, for those students who prefer to sit in front, will be able to see me after class, and I will see what I can do. Of course, not everyone can have the front row. Given circumstances beyond our control, not all of you who I know would usually be the first here, got here first. Let it be known, however, that the students who have sat in back have done just as well, if not better than those students who have sat in front. Lets take to chapter one. Also, you will learn to recognize when the horse needs to see a veterinarian. First things first. Never scare a horse. Never stand directly behind a horse. You will get kicked. Believe me! Now, everyone grab a brush and then line up and face me. I want everyone to see how to properly brush a horse.

INT. BIOLOGY 1

Students sit down at tables.

KAT

I can't beleive we are finally studying biology! It's not like we don't already know it. Tell me again why they insisted we start over?

BEV

We've not yet learned Jytty, or the other languages. Fortunately, we do know Japanese. They teach all of their science classes in Japanese.

KAT

BEV

KAT

I love this site!

BEV

I do too. Now, sh, lest we give ourselves away.

KAT

I can't beleive it! We are so good.

PROFESSOR JAPANESE 5

I want you to navigate to the memory games. Click on the first link. You will then check the first tick box. This will give you exactly 5 japanese cards to match with 5 english cards. After you think you have learned these 5 cards, you may check the next tick box that will give you 5 new cards and have you review the last 5. Each box after wards, will add 5 new cards to the previous cards. If you need to hear to pronunciation of any word, just go to the auditory page, where you can hear the word. Any questions?

STUDENT SNOT

So, you mean you aren't going to teach us then?

PROFESSOR JAPANESE 5

I didn't realize that I had a student who preferred to listen to boring drawn out lectures on the meaning of words? Our first task is to learn the vocabulary. KAT
Chapter 4 Italian.

BEV
Chapter 5 Italian.

KAT
Chapter 6!

BEV
Chapter 7.

KAT
chapter 2 Portuguese.

BEV
Chapter 4 Spanish.

KAT
Finished Spanish.

BEV
What?

KAT
Spanish was too easy. Besides, I type
faster than you do in Spanish.

BEV
That's true.

KAT

The answers can only be worded one way. Why don't you just take mine.

BEV

Nah, no need. I'll muddle through my typing.

KAT

Suit yourself.

Some more time passes.

KAT

Finished Portuguese. Japanese chapter 1.

BEV

Portuguese Chapter 6.

KAT

Japanese is going to take forever!

BEV

I know. However, we should use the romanji-kanji converter that we wrote instead of the buggy one.

KAT

I am!

BEV

Good. It shan't take as long.

KAT

That's true, but I still want to recheck everything.

BEV

I don't. I am just going to trust that we wrote the program correctly.

More time passes. They are eating cheese sandwiches for lunch with nothing but cheese and bread. No butter or other spreads.

KAT

If we weren't in such a hurry, I would kvetch about how dry the sandwiches are.

BEV

Well, I'm on Chapter 5! Beat that!

KAT

I'm on Chapter 6, going on 7.

BEV

I just have to learn to type faster!

KAT

It'll come. However, if we were to stand brain against brain and leave the typing out of it, I dare say we would tie.

BEV

I think you are quite right on that score.

KAT

I have an idea. Why don't I type what you dictate after I've finished my Japanese.

BEV

That'll work.

More time has passed.

KAT

I can't beleive that it is already fifteen hundred hours! And, we still haven't even gotten to the math yet!

BEV

Are we losing our touch or what?

KAT

BEV

KAT

BEV

BEV

KAT

That works out to 3 lessons in every subject we've done.

BEV

KAT

Of course! Being as no one is knocking on our door, lets go head up to our roof and finally plan that out. I think we have enough work done for this week.

Liz knocks on the door. Kat runs to answer it.

LIZ

KAT

KAT

BEV

KAT

BEV

KAT

Sounds good. I do wonder though, what if they stop jyntyan in and out of school when the school is closed.

BEV

I think we are going to have to figure out what that book we found says. It might have the solution we are looking for.

KAT

I wonder what else we can do? I mean, I don't want to put all of my eggs in one basket.

BEV

We'll think of something I'm sure.

KAT

Too bad we can't just put in a tunnel or something.

BEV

Tunnel? But of course! There is an old tunnel that was sealed up for safty reasons. They didn't want students sneaking out at night. I'm sure we could find it.

KAT

We'll find it later. We should put the main part of our house over the library. We'll have more room then.

BEV

And, I doubt they will redo that space and build up anytime soon.

KAT

Agreed.

BEV

Do we want to put in a ballroom?

KAT

Sure. Why not? We could make it look like a palace.

BEV

And with the 20 foot high walls, we could have a decent two story without chance of anyone getting the wiser.

KAT

They are 60 feet.

BEV

Whatever!

KAT

We'll be able to put in a real castle, complete with roof and everything.

BEV

One problem, how do we build it? Its not like we can go out and get a construction permit and all.

EXT. LIBRARY ROOF GARDEN - NIGHT

Kat and Bev walk around the garden pointing here and there in discussing where they could put things.

KAT

This hallway must have garages on either the left or the right. Then, the driveway goes up on the other side, and under the porte cochere.

BEV

KAT

BEV

KAT

BEV

KAT

BEV
Great!

KAT
I say we design a stain-glass water wall for each side, that becomes a waterfall. And, have that water end in pool made of special glass.

BEV

KAT

BEV

KAT

BEV

KAT

BEV

KAT

I know. Too bad we couldn't have changed the plats to make that house owned by us.

BEV

You know we couldn't afford it at that time.

KAT

Now that we can, we can't.

BEV

This place is much better anyways, because its owned by the school. And, the school has only plans to build out and not up.

KAT

Are they going to attach it to what existing?

BEV

Yes. And they are going to make the top exactly like here.

KAT

We can't do a thing until that is done.

BEV

Actually, we can. I've already got that settled.

KAT

How?

BEV

I happen to know the architect who is working on those plans.

KAT

Who?

BEV

Its a student here. A fellow geek.

KAT

Can we trust him?

BEV

Her. And, this is her last year here. Her sister was here when the openings to the roof was sealed.

KAT

How is that possible?

BEV

They are aliens from another planet. They do not have our life-spans.

KAT

Yes, but that would mean that they are over 20 years apart?

BEV

So? People are capable of having children earlier in life and late in life.

KAT

I know that. Its just that its so unusual.

BEV

No more unusual than your alien.

KAT
But thats different.

BEV
No its not.

KAT
Yes, it is. I'm used to him.

BEV
Well, now that we've got that settled, I suppose you want an iron gate at the end.

KAT
Yes, I do. But, what about the building of the new buildings. They are bound to have to get higher up to see whats here.

BEV
They don't know what is suppose to be here. Besides, she has a plan as to how this area can be built at the same time.

KAT
No! That will not work.

BEV
You don't know who is building it.

KAT
Okay, who?

BEV
Her family. They have special abilities that allow them to build faster than is humanly possible. They have special tools and everything. She says that it was her family that build this school in the first place.

KAT
Really?

BEV
We just need to map out what we want, and she will do the rest.

KAT

Whoa! But at what cost? I don't want the school paying for that.

BEV

The school isn't. They are donating everything to the school. They want to do this. She said to not ask how they do it, but just believe that it won't cost the family much either and it will be perfectly legal because how they do it.

KAT

Are they capable of molecular rearrangement or something?

BEV

Do you really think that is how they do it?

KAT

Yes. Did you show her that book we found?

BEV

No. I wasn't sure that it would be wise. I was afraid that she would want it back.

KAT

She might be able to help us solve its mysteries.

BEV

I'd rather crack that nut myself.

KAT

Fine. Let's just sit down and map out the...

Lonya jyntys in.

LONYA

Sorry to scare you. I'm Lonya.

BEV

Hello, Lonya. This is Kat.

KAT

Please to meet you.

LONYA

By the way, I have not left any books behind from my native planet. So, that book you were talking about, I wouldn't know anything about. However, it might have been planted by a good alien or a bad alien.

KAT

A bad alien?

LONYA

Yes. I was forcefully jyntyed to another universe. A guy names Jez jyntyed in and rescued me. It all happened so quick, that I was back where I belonged in the next second.

KAT

Jez? What did he look like? Did he have blue-green skin? Pointed ears? Trademark eyebrows?

LONYA

You know him?

KAT

Only in my dreams. I've wanted to meet him so badly. You can't imagine how badly.

BEV

She has had a serious crush on him ever since he first popped up in her dreams.

KAT

It is not a crush! It fully explains why I've not had crushes on anyone - male or female.

LONYA

Have people been trying to convince you that you were a lesbian?

KAT

Yes. Rather annoying, really. You would think that I would know if I was a lesbian or not, especially since the one I've been dreaming about is definitely male.

LONYA

Oh yes, he is. And, I believe he is not taken. Well, I can't really know that for sure. He has been writing me from time to time, to make sure I'm safe. He wanted me to not tell anyone. However, I think that you were meant for him. I happen to know for a fact that he wouldn't plant images of himself in your brain.

BEV

How could you know him that well?

LONYA

KAT

So, you want us to link then?

LONYA

KAT

BEV

No it doesn't, we can go there to window shop.

Jyz jyntys in. Kat begins to faint. Jyz catches her.

JYZ

Hello everyone! The constructionist extraordinaire at your service. I felt that I should make my acquaintance. Unfortunately, I wasn't expecting Kat to faint on me. Hey Kytter! Its okay, your love has you.

BEV

Kytter? And who are you?

JYZ

Permit me to introduce meself. I am Jyz, an alien from another planet who has been watching you two from a far for a very long time. And, I do support the running away of you two for very good reasons. Your parents are bloody...well, lets just say I disagree with them. And Kytter...It's my nickname for her. Its actually the name she will have when she finally moves to my planet.

BEV

I don't understand.

JYZ

LONYA

You are a prince?

JYZ

Actually, I'm a Prince who they want as a King. I told them that I won't take on the role until after I've found my Queen and the one in my dreams, and not anyone they have picked out.

KAT

JYZ

KAT

The Lord?

JYZ

KAT

But me, a Queen? How?

JYZ

I know you already. I know that he witnessed to you when you were 1 1/2 years old.

BEV

I'm sure we can manage on our own. Besides, we have Lonya.

JYZ

Have you ever wondered why the walls are 60 feet tall? Or why all the holes but two were sealed up?

BEV

I'm sure the school had very good reasons for doing that.

JYZ

KAT

BEV

KAT

BEV

KAT

BEV

KAT

So, how do we apply that to a room?

BEV

Easy. We make a Jewish prayer room that doesn't quite fit the rules.

KAT

Bare with me please, but why?

BEV

It's just a suggestion. It would give it a reason to exist and can be our own little joke. YOU know, like us. We are sort of like crum. We are pretending to be strict law abiding, but really aren't.

KAT

You're right. We are like crums. However, what if someone finds this place? What do we want them to see when they find it?

BEV

Don't worry. It'll work out.

KAT

How do we explain us with no driveway. How do we explain a driveway where no driveway has existed for years?

BEV

You aren't really making any sense.

KAT

What if someone finds us?

BEV

No one knows this is here. I've watched. No one walks down our road. Not even children. Besides, we can put up a fence around the house. We will have the money soon. And, if you go straight back and through the trees, it leads to another road. All we have to do is make it look like our driveway leads to that road.

KAT

I'm not sure about that. Well, we have some time to decide. I just keep thinking of that mansion that was vacant for years and years, then all of a sudden turned into condos or apartments. I forget which, but you know what I mean.

BEV

I know. I did check the records. this place isn't even on the map.

KAT

No record exists?

BEV

None. And, no record of the land either.

KAT

know I'm asking lots of questions, but...how did you find that out without anyone knowing what land you were talking about?

BEV

That part was easy. It's called being at the right place at the right time.

KAT

huh?

BEV

You see, I just happened to walk into the government center where a map of this area was placed. It was a plat map. To make a long story short, I took it to the photo copier and quickly made copies, and then put it back. They are going to put in homes behind us, but leave the trees. They had blueprints and detailed notes. I copied everything. They are under the impression, that those row of trees are the property of the homes in front of us.

KAT

That just seems to good to be true.

BEV

I know. So, when this man came back, looking for them, I asked him about those trees and who owned them. He pointed to a row of houses, the ones in front of us, and said that they owned those trees. Then he assured me that the trees were safe.

KAT

He thought you were concerned about the trees?

BEV

Well, he had to come to some sort of conclusion. Anyways, should we continue?

Kat and Bev walk pass the den. Bev gives a detailed description of everything.

BEV

Nex to the den, was the gothic stairway leading to the even more gothic second floor which housed many rooms that they thought were sitting rooms. Ornate wooded beams ordained the ceiling and walls. It was like walking through a gothic castle or palace. Another stairwell led to the third floor where the bedrooms were, and then on to the attic. To the right of the stairway, and a few short feet, sat the tall black water fountain. with two swans on top. A few short feet to the right of the fountain, was another stairwell. KAT

We are going to have so much fun playing hide seek.

BEV

I so agree.

KAT

Who lived here?

BEV

I don't know. NO one really knows. This is the place that time has forgotten. Its our new home.

KAT

You know, we will be able to finally get away from our praents and fourth grade forever. As long as we buy just the right amount of food to last us only until the food would have spoiled. And then go back into town only when we have to.

BEV

I know. Its perfect, isn't it?

KAT

Yes, perfect. Well, how is it we have electircity?

BEV

that is the funny part. We have watermill in a shed outback. some how, that supp, lies us with electiricy. We won't have internet access though.

KAT

We can survive though. But how are you going to keep your site up to date?

BEV

Well, we do have access, but connecting to it won't be safe. Anyone can view who is connected to their internet.

KAT

I'm not worried. All we need to do buy a wi-fi extender, and connect to the public wi-fi. that library a block from here, has a very stornq signal.

BEV

yes, but wouldn't our device hsow up as being connected to the librarires internet? Adn taht could be bad!

KAT

I know. But, there is a way we can find out.

BEV

How?

KAT

We could use one computer to connect to the neighbor's internet, and then use the other computer, and the device to connect to the first computer.

BEV

Problem. We don't have wi-fi. And, we can't connect the two computer by using that device without setting up an intranet.

KAT

yea, right. bother! And that was such a good idea too.

BEV

We could just ask at the store if this device shows up at all on. I mean, it will show up on our computer, but whether it will show up on someone else's computer if they were to...thats not going to work. The story is all wrong. We need to ask if someone could use this device to connect to our internet, and if they were to, whether that device would show up on our computers.

KAT

And, we'll say its for a story we are writing.

BEV

Then, we will go to another store to buy it so we aren't found out.

KAT

right! We are going to want new appliances, aren't we?

BEV

Yes, but we have no way to get them here. Those things are heavy!

KAT

I know. We'll come up with something. We'll have to get a trailer that can hold the wait, and connect trailer to a double bike. It will be risky to operate, but it should work."
"To bad we can't just rent a truck or something.

BEV

Well, I did score high on the driving simulator. I only blew one stop sign. But, that was a glitch in the program. The stop sign wasn't there and then popped up.

KAT

I wouldn't count anything that program did as proof of being able to handle a car. Besides, its not like the simulator is just like driving a car under real conditions. And, we wouldn't be able to lift those appliances.

BEV

Sure we will. I bought these straps a long time ago. I thought we might need them someday.

KAT

You are a god send! Lets go! Wait. We need to get groceries in here first.

BEV

Will the know you are gone?

KAT

No silly, not until Monday, when I don't show up for school or come home after school. They won't piece things together until they've talked with the school. How about you?

BEV

My dad is on a business trip and my mom is out with the ladies. I got permission to stay at your house all weekend so she could have the house to herself for once, as your parents weren't going to get a break anyhow, and would appreciate me giving you something to do.

KAT

Your mother will believe anything won't she?

BEV

Well, not exactly. She asked me if this was what I was planning all along. So, I had to tell yes with a big sheepish smile. Fortunately, the emotions for being caught in a lie, and caught with the truth, was the same in this situation.

KAT

Will she call my parents this weekend?

BEV

No. she staing at that resort spa with the ladies, the one with the movie theaters in every private pool room.

KAT

The Ritzaratti? I'm so jealous!

BEV

We will just have to make our own here.

KAT

We can't! They have real swedish massuesses. We don't.

BEV

well, at least we can lounge in a pool with a movie theater. Besides, massuesses are over rated.

KAT

Speak for yourself. WEll, what should we do first, but a ton of groceries or what?

BEV

I think we should go check in the garage to see what we find. I've not touched those yet.

INT. GARAGE - DAY

A twenty two years old car was found in every garage. One large moving truck was found in the last garage.

BEV

Sweet! A moving truck! These haven't changed their style in years, so using this should be great.

KAT

Its settled. Lets get in.

BEV

Problem.

KAT

What?

BEV

I've not driven a stick yet. Well,
not at least, enough. You, know, in
the simulator.

KAT

Lets go run up to the gas station and
pump in some new gas.

BEV

No need.

KAT

That gas is going to be too old.

BEV

This truck doesn't run on gas.

KAT

How do you know that?

BEV

Look at the roof! It has the state of
the art solar panels on it, you know
the kind. Its the ones that produce
more electricity and uses it more
effectively then the kind they used
to have.

KAT

Really? Sweet!

INT. PALACE - DAY

Jyz rallies to get Kat's attention.

JYZ

Kat! Kat! Are you with us?

KAT

What if they find us, like they did
the last time? It was horrible.
They'll homeschool us and never let
us out of there site again.

BEV

They already wanted to take us out of
this school.

JYZ

That's where I come in. You see, I have the ability to alter minds when, and only when the greater good can only be accomplished that way. Or, if, not doing so immediately would risk a life of someone who was already destined for planet Jyttryzae.

BEV

You mean Kat, don't you?

JYZ

I do. But seeing as you are her dearest friend, I've argued with the Lord that you should be allowed to come with.

BEV

What if I don't wish to go?

JYZ

Neither you nor Kat have to go. Its strictly by choice. And, after you two are emotionally and mentally ready for the move. That does mean, however, that I might have a very long wait indeed for my Queen.

KAT

Queen? Me? Are you off your rockers?

BEV

She couldn't possibly know the first thing about being a Queen, even if she has been born in a country with royalty and a Queen galvanting all around.

JYZ

No one becomes a Queen without being groomed, or taught. I assure you, that Kat and yourself, have already done much towards educating her with the best qualities for a Queen. You see, she contains one quality that is prized above all others.

KAT
What's that?

JYZ
The ability to think and reason
without regard to authorities
preconceived solutions.

KAT
How did you draw that conclusion?

JYZ
Your banterings with John, of course.

KAT
Well, John is a bit, well you know -
much.

JYZ
True, he is a bit of a bloody arse.
But, you must realize, he has had
years of experience that has trained
him to be this way. He was the first
man on earth to be so gifted.

BEV
With powers, you mean?

JYZ
Yes, I do mean. Anyways, we should
really continue the tour.

INT. KITCHEN - DUSK

Jyz shows them around the kitchen and the pantry.

JYZ
You will notice that I made sure to
put in only the finest stove, oven,
and microwaves.

KAT
Wolf! My favorite brand!

BEV
Not that it's gotten the best reviews
or anything. It hasn't.

JYZ
I fixed their design problems.

KAT

I'm sure that was easy for you.

JYZ

But, of course. And, over here, you will see more cupboards than you will ever need in your lifetime. Well, then again, if Kat is allowed to do all the shopping she would love to do, then that might not be the case anymore.

BEV

We are going to have to eat soon.

JYZ

After I show you the garden. I'd rather fancy calling it a Jardin. Would you?

BEV

I know Kat would. She writes Jardin on every garden she designs.

JYZ

Do you?

KAT

Jardin and Wasser.

JYZ

Do you always mix your languages/

KAT

Always. I take the word that sound the prettiest in any language, and use it.

JYZ

You are funny.

KAT

Thank you! Thank you!

BEV

Knock it off! That wasn 't an opportunity to bow you silly!

KAT

Who says. If I want to bow, I shall do it, and gracefully at that. After all, you are looking at the future Queen of...Wait a minute! You're a prince!

JYZ

Yes, I am a Prince.

BEV

Doh! Who did you think he was? A government official, out scouting for a girl to kidnap and make into a Queen?

JYZ

Well, it could happen I suppose. I just thought if I was going to have a mate for life, I'd rather pick her out from the get go.

KAT

You mean, you don't fancy a cattle call line up, with now choose the best looking one, the plumpest most fattest one that'll make you the most meat on your table?

JYZ

No, especially since I don't eat meat.

KAT

You're a vegetarian?

JYZ

Vegan.

BEV

How do you get enough b-12.

JYZ

I manufacture it myself. You see, my body isn't made like yours is. It makes all the vitamins and minerals I need.

BEV

Strange.

JYZ

I suppose, I should really show you how I really look. My skin is naturally...

KAT

Blue with a hint of green!

BEV

How do you know...Whoa!

JYZ

She's right. Did the Lord give you a dream about me? I know I did not alter your brain. I wanted you to make up your mind from the get go.

KAT

I already have. And yes, the Lord did give me the dream. Only, I thought it was me making it up until I saw you.

JYZ

I'm so happy. Wait a minute. What aren't you telling me?

KAT

I had a crush on you since I was 3 years old.

JYZ

But that's impossible! I wasn't even on earth until you were 6!

KAT

So? Why should that matter to the Lord?

JYZ

Point taken.

KAT

I used to dream that you were only mine - that I had you all to myself.

JYZ

Did you plan the wedding and all too?

KAT

No. I didn't like how a wedding usually is here. Its too predictable. the same music, the same walk up the aisle, the same lighting of the unity candle. It just seemed so secular and not of God.

JYZ

Well, actually, it can be of God. It depends on where the heart is really. You will be pleased to know, that on my planet, the ritual is different.

KAT

How so?

JYZ

We dance up the aisle.

KAT

Dance?

JYZ

And worship the Lord while we are doing it.

BEV

But, what is a bride had two left feet?

KAT

Or worse yet, the groom?

JYZ

I'm sure you dance very well. We also have some of the wedding party waving flags. And some people dance with tallits flying over their heads.

KAT

It sounds like a Jewish wedding with a twist.

JYZ

It is similiar. And the chuppah, as they call it, we do use. It does symbolize the Lord as head of us.

Jyz leads them out onto the porch area, where the gardens begin.

JYZ

Here is the lovely umbrella table the comfortable seats 6 without worries of too much rain or too much sun. And over here is a waterfall made especially for you two.

KAT

I love it.

BEV

I do too!

KAT

I can't wait to study out here.

BEV

Did you hide those books?

JYZ

Yes, I did hide that book. But, only one book. Did you find another book?

BEV

Yes. Its in our secret room, on our bookshelf.

JYZ

You two stay here. I'll jaunt and get it.

KAT

Fine.

BEV

You don't really beleive him do you?

KAT

I do. And for very good reasons!

BEV

Anyone could alter your mind. He even said that he could.

KAT

I don't care tuppence what he says. I know what the Lord has told me.

BEV

How do you know it was the Lord and not him?

KAT

When you hear from the Lord, you will know. You see, the Lord did speak to me, but without pictures this time. He told me that I will meet someone who I was to marry without question, as he would not just rescue me from parents who have done me wrong, but would show me how to really truly live according to the ways of the bible.

BEV

how do you know that? I mean, it still could have been Jyz!

KAT

Jyz did talk to me in my mind. I know what that feels like and sound like. I can assure you, it was not him before.

BEV

I jsut don't know.

KAT

Just because you have been taught to not trust anyone, doesn't mean I have to live with your fear. Besides, we won't be going anywheres for a very long time. He even said so.

BEV

I just don't trust him!

KAT

Really? You could have fooled me! You would think that he lied to us and we really aren't still on top of the school's roof.

JYZ

I'm back with the book. This is the one you mean? Right?

BEV

Yes, thats the one.

JYZ

I'm glad you've told me about it. I'm sorry. I didn't realize that a bad guy from my planet was here as well.

BEV

A bad guy?

JYZ

Yes. I did examine your entire room for traps and other evil devices.

BEV

Evil?

JYZ

I happen to know exactly what this book says. He intended for you two to make a special box that is really a trap. One in which neither of you would ever escape.

KAT

A box thats a trap?

JYZ

yes. On my planet, we make special boxes all the time. We can make the locks anything we want to. If an intruder goes in without permission, it will trap them.

BEV

That should be banned!

JYZ

Why?

BEV

Its sound too dangerous! Think of the kids! Siblings! They could kill each other off!

JYZ

Trust me. They don't. Parents are much more aware of what their children are doing on my planet then they are on yours.

KAT
I thought so.

JYZ
And, some people, are very good at
figuring out locks and breaking their
spells so that people can be rescued.

KAT
You mean, people like you.

JYZ
Yes, I am such a person.

KAT
I would really like to go there some
time.

JYZ
I bet you would really love to see my
box too.

KAT
Oh would I!

BEV
I forbid it!

JYZ
Bev, if I didn't know better, I'd say
you were already brainwashed into
living a life of fear.

KAT
She has. Her father is scared of his
own shadow.

JYZ
I'm quite aware of that.

KAT
Isn't there something we can do for
her?

JYZ
Yes, there is, but I'd rather not do
anything without her permission. It
is rules of my planet.

KAT

Okay, I'll try to wait patiently while she finally comes around. You will come around, won't you?

BEV

Maybe.

JYZ

Well, shall we go in and eat? Dusk is quickly turning into dark. We can turn on the lights out here, without disturbing anyone. I put in a dark layer that prevents all light up here from being seen from below or from elsewhere.

KAT

That's cool!

BEV

I want to test it.

JYZ

Fine. Would you rather be up here with the light, or down there, making sure that the light doesn't exist?

BEV

Id' rather be in both places.

JYZ

As you wish.

Jyz splits Bev into two people. He sends one person to the ground below.

BEV

What are you doing?

KAT

Relax! He's only doing what you requested!

JYZ

I'll sort you out after you see your proof.

Jyz puts Bev back into one person. Bev moves inside. Kat and Jyz linger.

JYZ

Je vous ai aimés pendant un temps
très long.

KAT

J'avais mes yeux fixés sur toi devant
le Seigneur m'a même dit vous avez
été les miens.

JYZ

Voulez-vous vraiment que moi pour
modifier son cerveau?

KAT

Oui!

JYZ

Pensez-vous que vous et j'aurais pu
promenades ensemble - après avoir
endormi?

KAT

Oui! Let's go in.

JYZ

Okay. What will it be pizza, mac and
cheese, or shall we go out for
salmon.

KAT

Definately Salmon!

BEV

But you don't eat salmon?

JYZ

I know. I convert it to a lovely
animal free pasta dish in my mouth.
In that way, no one is the wiser.

INT. BED - NIGHT

Kat and Bev are lying down.

KAT

He is so wonderful!

BEV

He is an alien!

KAT

I know! Isn't it wonderful?

BEV

Wonderful? You dont' know a thing
about him.

KAT

I know more about him than you will
ever know!

BEV

I doubt it.

KAT

I knew the man in my dreams had blue
and green skin. I said so before he
showed us.

BEV

He planted that in your head.

KAT

You are such a sour puss.

BEV

I'm just cautious, that's all.

KAT

You wouldn't believe that a million
pounds of gold that was given to you
by the police was honest gold and not
stolen.

BEV

I am not that much of an idiot!

KAT

You said it. Not I.

BEV

I did not say I was an idiot.

KAT

No, you merely implied it. Anyways,
just give him time. You'll see.

BEV

You can not live on another planet!

KAT

Says who?

BEV

You don't even know if you are allergic to him or not.

KAT

Says who? Are you going to trying to stop him? You? A, dare I use Harry Potter's word for it? A Muggle?

BEV

Very funny!

KAT

I am sure that the Lord knows what he is doing.

BEV

We don't even know if it is the Lord who is speaking to you.

KAT

Correction. You don't know if it is the Lord who is speaking to me. I already know - doubting thomas.

BEV

dont' call me doubting thomas.

KAT

Then knock it off and start supporting me for once!

BEV

Why should I? We've tried to run away before and it backed fired!

KAT

I know! Thats because you have the gall to talk to that man who then became suspicious.

BEV

I did not say anything that would have alerted him to the error.

KAT

Really? You could have fooled me. If you wouldn't have pointed out those trees, they might not have flown a plane overhead to see their error.

BEV

They would have flown that plane anyhow! We can't stop everything.

KAT

Which is exactly why we are much safer on another planet.

BEV

We can't possibly be safe on another planet. John will find us. You know he will!

KAT

No, he won't. You see. Planet Jyttyrzae isn't in this universe.

BEV

What?

KAT

It isn't in this universe.

BEV

A universe consist of everything out there, whether you see it or not.

KAT

And imagine that multiplied by thousands.

BEV

You know that Stephen what's his name has been debunked.

KAT

You don't realize how awful it would have been if those blackholes would have been found to be keys to other universes - universes that are pristene?

BEV

What are you talking about?

KAT

You know how earth has been trashed by man!

BEV

yes, I do know. But, how do you know
taht other planets haven't had the
same issue?

KAT

I happen to know that many planets
have had similiar issues. However,
planet Jyttryzae is different. They
as a planet, actively follow the
bible.

BEV

Then Jyz was lying. There is no bad
guy.

KAT

No, he was not lying. Not 100% of the
people are good there. He wil find
the one who went astray.

BEV

I still don't know.

KAT

Trust him, will you?

BEV

What will your children be like?

KAT

Milato? Half blue-green and half
white? I don't know.

BEV

What if they are born not able to
have children?

KAT

What different will that make? Many
people on earth aren't capable of
having children.

BEV

But they were born that way! I'm
talking about two species not meant
to mate, mating.

KAT

How do you know we weren't meant to mate? He may be a non-earthling, but he is still human. Or, do you think that all people on other planets aren't capable of marrying earthlings lest they be celebrate. And, that Carol and that creature she married aren't capable of having kids?

BEV

They never had kids.

KAT

And that all the people back at the trig are living a big fat lie because all those kids were stolen from species who didn't intermarry?

BEV

I'm not talking about the kids on the trig! I'm talking about you and Jyz!

KAT

I'm talking about a bloody fool who refuses to face reality because she is too scared shitless to face it!

BEV

Fine! Be that way! I'll just sleep elsewhere!

KAT

No. I'll sleep elsewhere.

Kat moves up the ladder and into the hidden den, and then outside. She walks to the palace.

EXT. ROOF GARDEN - NIGHT

Kat calls out loudly in her mind for Jyz, while she walks towards the palace.

KAT

Jyz! Jyz!

JYZ

I'm coming.

KAT

Bev is so stubborn. She insisted on talking it out and making me see reason.

JYZ

I know. I heard the whole thing.

KAT

Now she won't fall asleep.

JYZ

She doesn't have to put herself to sleep in order for me to work my magic on her. Stay here. I'll be right back.

Jyz jaunts off. A few minutes later, he jaunts back in to Kat.

JYZ

I finished. When she wakes up, she will be on your side. I hate to do it. But, she was so stubborn, that I was afraid she would go tell John and Liz. Then, I would have to rescue you all over again!

KAT

Why didn't you cause them to not see that land?

JYZ

I couldn't. Bev had saw me, freaked out, and then blabbered to everyone about the land.

KAT

Bev saw you?

JYZ

Yes. Only then, I looked quite human and had brown hair. I changed my look completely to be human like commonly found on earth. I got rid of my pointed ears for the time period too.
